



KAMM Regional Representative's Fact Sheet

How Regional Representatives Support KAMM:

The Kentucky Association of Mitigation Managers (KAMM) was formed in order to promote natural hazard mitigation and management in Kentucky. Our members represent local floodplain coordinators, planning and zoning officials, engineers, surveyors, GIS specialists, hydrologists, public safety and emergency managers. A regional representative creates in-roads into these professions at the local level through:

1. Promoting KAMM to local professionals
2. Representing KAMM at local meetings
3. Encouraging new membership, and
4. Coordinating mitigation related information between KAMM and local members.

Each regional representative serves a two (2) year term.

The purpose of KAMM is to provide a means for state and local mitigation managers to join with others regarding mitigation policies and activities. Regional representatives work towards this purpose by:

1. Organizing and promoting regional meetings of KAMM members including trainings, project updates, and fact sharing sessions.
2. Participating in the development of the KAMM state-wide conference,
3. Responding as an elected official and voting board member, and
4. Disseminating information from KAMM elected officials and other members to local members.
5. Providing regional information for uploading to our website www.kymitigation.org
